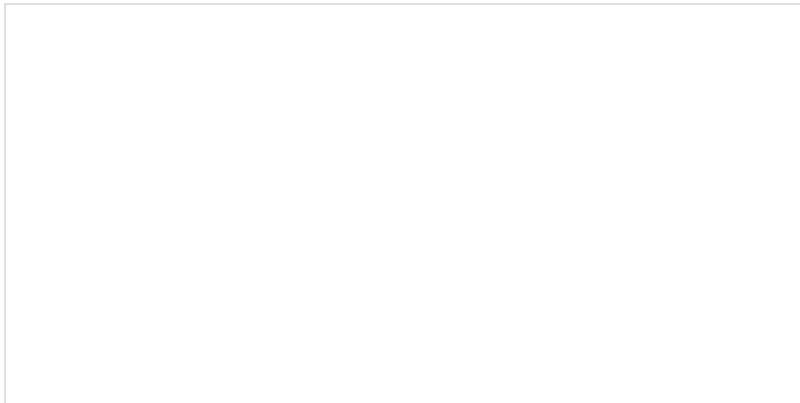


# Reiner Schürmann Lecture on Philosophical Anthropology

## Description

The New School Archives staff believes this recording was made in a lecture associated with the seminar, Philosophical Anthropology: An Introduction, taught in the Spring 1989 semester at the New School for Social Research.
